

NOTICE OF HEARING

To: The Public Service Companies That Have Fully Executed Supplier Diversity Memoranda of Understanding¹ and Interested Persons

The Public Service Commission ("Commission") hereby schedules a hearing to begin at

10 a.m., on Tuesday, June 13, 2017, in its 16th Floor Hearing Room, William Donald Schaefer

Tower, 6 St. Paul Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21202. The purpose of the hearing is:

to consider the report from the Commission's Technical Staff ("Staff") that summarizes the data from the 2016 Maryland Supplier Diversity Program Annual Reports ("2016 Annual Reports") filed with the Commission by the Reporting Companies, including any issues that may have come to Staff's attention during its review of the 2016 Annual Reports ("Staff Report"); and

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to hear any comments from each Reporting Company on the portion of the Staff Report applicable to the Company and to discuss with representatives of each Reporting Company, which representatives shall include a senior executive from the Reporting Company,² on the status of the Company's efforts implementing the MOU, including goals, collection of data, resolution of disputes, etc. In addition, the Commission invites all parties to comment on theme "Forward: Nurturing Success." While the acknowledging significant achievements in the Supplier Diversity program, the Commission recognizes the importance of maintaining and striving to exceed even more ambitious goals.

The Staff shall submit an original and seventeen paper copies, and an electronic copy,³ of its Staff Report to David J. Collins, Executive Secretary, Maryland Public Service Commission,
