

Recertification Guide

Applications Received Between 07/01/2024 and 01/31/2025

Application Submission Process

1. Email Notification

- Applicants will receive an email from CharlesHerbert@marylandpsccom.onmicrosoft.com containing a unique link to a Microsoft SharePoint site.
- It is critical to ensure that the marylandpsccom.onmicrosoft.com domain is on the “safe list” of the applicants’ respective domains, otherwise, the email may be flagged as spam.

2. Accessing SharePoint

- The SharePoint site will include:
 - A certification request form for projects seeking “BT” certification.
 - An Excel sheet listing all eligible projects for the “BT” certification.

3. Form Completion and Upload

- Applicant must:
 - Complete the certification request form.
 - Mark eligible projects in the provided Excel sheet with a “Yes” (indicating each project requesting “BT” Certification).
 - Upload the completed form and Excel sheet to SharePoint.

4. Additional Documentation

- Some projects may require supplemental information in addition to the form and Excel sheet.
- Guidance on supplemental documentation is outlined below.
- Required documents should be submitted via SharePoint.

5. Issue Letter Order with the New Certification Number

6. Payment

- We will contact you for your mail and billing information
 - Invoices will be mailed to the address you provide.
- You would have 30 days to mail a check to the Public Service Commission.

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Supplemental Documentation Requirements

For projects 20kw AC and below:

- These projects will automatically receive the “BT” certification starting on 01/01/2025, or the respective application date if applied after 01/01/2025.

For Projects Between 20 kw and 5 MW AC:

- If located on a building rooftop, parking lot, or parking structure:
 - Submit a **copy of the final approved local building permit**.
 - The permit can be obtained from the local jurisdiction or county where the project is located.
- If located on a brownfield site:
 - Provide **documentation confirming the project site is a designated brownfield**.
 - Brownfield site criteria are outlined by the Maryland Department of Environment.

- If used for Aggregate Net metering:
 - The project must be below 2 MW AC
 - Submit a **copy of the Aggregate Net Metering Rider filed with the Interconnection Agreement**.
 - Additional details can be obtained from the local utility provider.

Note: The Commission can request additional from the applicant if needed in order to certify a project to receive the Multiplier SREC “BT” Certification
