# **Telecommunications in Maryland**

### Who Regulates Telecommunications Services?

- Federal: Interstate and international telecommunications
  - Interstate and international public switched telephone service
  - Voice over Internet Protocol Service (VOIP)
  - Cellular telephone service
  - Internet
- State: Intrastate and local telecommunications within Maryland\*
  - Intrastate/local public switched telephone service
  - Telegraph service

\*Commission-regulated

- Local: Rights of way authority over where infrastructure like poles and towers can go
  - Federal government can supersede

# Technology

- **Copper:** traditional copper wires that transmit data with electrical pulses (electrons).
- **Fiber:** newer optical fibers or glass wires that transmit data with infrared laser light (photons).

## **Maryland Policies**

- Maryland Lifeline: local telephone companies with more than 10,000 subscribers are required to offer qualifying low-income consumers reducedcost service.
  - More detail are available in <u>Section 8-201 of the Public Utilities Article of the Annotated Code</u> of Maryland.
- **9-1-1 System:** emergency telephone system operated by the counties (police, fire fighting, and ambulance).
  - More details are available in <u>Section 1-304 of the Public Safety Article of the Annotated Code</u> of Maryland.

#### **Federal Policies**

- **FCC Lifeline**: Program for reduced-cost cell phone or internet service
  - Universal Service Administrative Company administers (<u>https://www.usac.org/lifeline/</u>)
