INTERIM RESULTS

For the period January 1, 2009 thru June 30, 2009, overall spend with Minority/Women and Service-Disabled were \$26.5M, representing 8.9% of overall spend. (Schedule F) The following is a breakdown comparing Maryland's PSC Mid-Term Goal vs. Mid-Term Actual. BGE's 2009 Year-End Estimate is forecasted to be approximately 6% compared to the annual goal of 10%.

The primary reasons for the difference are:

- Natural Gas Spend is down approximately 40%. As a result, overall spend with diverse natural gas suppliers is also down 40%, which represents approximately 3.0 percentage points
- A diverse supplier that manufactures top quality custom-designed switchgear was impacted by an estimated \$5M reduction compared to 2008, which represents an additional .70 percentage points

BGE is actively implementing initiatives to increase supplier diversity spend as follows:

• Operational Sourcing

o Identified opportunities targeting diverse suppliers for the remainder of 2009 and beyond

• 2nd Tier Process

o The goal is to implement a sustainable solution to capture 2nd Tier spend beginning in 2010 making it easier for Prime Suppliers to report. Further, BGE is currently negotiating 2nd tier commitments from prime suppliers.

• Supplier Diversity Forum-

On June 8, 2009 BGE hosted a Utility Forum on Supplier Diversity. The goal was to involve supply chain and supplier diversity professionals from Baltimore Gas & Electric/Constellation and other utilities to enable collective progress toward achieving 25% diversity spend. In that meeting, we had representatives from Allegheny, Baltimore Gas/Constellation Energy, Pepco/PHI and Washington Gas. Our next meeting is scheduled for September 3, 2009, in Baltimore, Maryland

• Diverse Supplier Outreach

- o In May, 2009 participated in a panel discussion at the Edison Electric Institute Supplier Diversity Conference in Chandler, Arizona, entitled The Memorandum of Understanding "Coming to an Area Near You" A Case Study. Also serving on the panel were Honorable Douglas R. M. Nazarian, Chairman, Maryland PSC and Honorable Harold Williams, Commissioner, Maryland PSC. The panel discussion focused on the 2008 Administrative Docket PC16, issued by the State of Maryland Public Service Commission that sets forth an aspirational goal of 25% supplier diversity spend for Utilities
- O Conducted 15- 1/1 matchmaker sessions with diverse suppliers at the Edison Electric Institute's Supplier Diversity Conference, in an effort to build a robust database of certified and qualified suppliers

• Government Compliance/Reporting & Tracking

- o Terms and Conditions in all contracts have been strengthened to include the Utilization of Minority, Women and Service-disabled businesses
- Participation of Certified Minority, Women-Owned and Service Disabled Veteran-Owned Business Enterprise language included in all Request for Proposals and Request for Quotes
- o Prime Contractors must provide periodic reports to BGE detailing supplier diversity spend for subcontracting/2nd tier spend with diverse suppliers

BGE has made significant progress in awarding major contracts to diverse suppliers. Following is a sample of some of the recent multi-year awards to diverse suppliers.

For the remainder of the year and beyond, BGE will spend a significant amount of our overall budget in the following categories: Underground Construction, Overhead Utility Work, Substation and Transmission Construction and Vegetation Management. Unfortunately, there are limited diverse suppliers in the sourcing categories mentioned above, making it a huge challenge to meet our expected goals.

Some of the major challenges for BGE are as follows:

- o Identifying viable diverse suppliers for the major categories listed above
- Assisting prime suppliers in helping to identify subcontracting/2nd tier opportunities for diverse suppliers
- O Increasing the "bid response" rate among diverse suppliers which will ultimately result in additional awards
