GRANT OF MOTION TO EXCEED PAGE LIMIT FOR REPLY BRIEF

To: Service List – Case No. 9361

On March 6, 2015, Exelon Corporation, Pepco Holdings, Inc., Potomac Electric Power Company, and Delmarva Power & Light Company (collectively, “Joint Applicants”)¹ filed with the Maryland Public Service Commission (“Commission”) a Motion for Leave to Exceed the Page Limit for the Joint Applicants’ Reply Brief (“Motion”). In its Motion, the Joint Applicants ask the Commission to waive the 60-page limitation on briefs contained in COMAR 20.07.02.06 and permit the Joint Applicants to file a reply brief up to 75 pages in length, if necessary (excluding the table of contents, the table of authorities, and the appendix). The Joint Applicants indicate that it is making this request out of an abundance of caution so as to avoid a last-minute request in the event that a robust response to the other parties’ positions require additional pages.

The Commission has considered the Joint Applicants’ Motion to exceed the page limitation on reply briefs. The Commission finds good cause to extend the page limit to 75 pages (excluding the table of contents, the table of authorities, and the appendix) on reply briefs for all parties in this proceeding. The Commission directs that all briefs should be submitted in a 12-point or greater font size.
