NOTICE OF HEARING

To: All Parties of Record and Interested Persons

The Maryland Public Service Commission ("Commission") hereby gives notice of hearing on Thursday, April 18, 2019, at 2:00 p.m., for the Standard Offer Service ("SOS") Bid Monitor consultant and the Commission's Technical Staff to brief the Commission on the conduct of the April 15, 2019 solicitations for offers for quarterly contracts for the Type II SOS load by each of The Potomac Edison Company, Baltimore Gas and Electric Company, Delmarva Power & Light Company, and Potomac Electric Power Company (collectively, the "IOUs") and the results, in conjunction with the hearing for review of the IOU's residential and/or Type I SOS load procurement results.¹ Each IOU is hereby directed to provide Commission Staff, no later than 9 a.m., Wednesday, April 17, 2019, with the retail bill impact data consistent with the results of the April 15, 2019 bids to ensure that Staff is able to file its written testimony in the matter prior to the hearing commencement time.

The hearing will be held in the Frank O. Heintz Hearing Room, 16th Floor, William Donald Schaefer Tower, 6 St. Paul Street, Baltimore, Maryland 21202. As discussed in Order No. 81102 in Case No. 9064,² the Commission will conduct a review of confidential and highly commercially sensitive bidder specific data during the process and at the hearing. The public briefing, therefore, will include only the information that can be made public under the provisions of the request for proposals and the full requirement service agreement. Additionally, the Commission will solicit remarks from any of the parties and members of the public following the briefing. To the extent necessitated by confidentiality considerations, the Commission will employ *in camera* procedures.
