On September 29, 2016, the Washington Gas Light Company (“WGL”) filed with the Maryland Public Service Commission (“Commission”) a Motion to Strike regarding certain pages of the Memorandum on Appeal filed by the State of Maryland Office of the Attorney General (“State”) on behalf of the University of Maryland College Park (“UMCP”) in the above-referenced matter. The Motion alleges several violations by the State of the Code of Maryland Regulations (“COMAR”) 20.07.02.13, which governs the procedure for appeals from Proposed Orders of a Public Utility Law Judge. WGL also requested in the Motion that it be given additional time to respond to UMCP’s Memorandum on Appeal which, pursuant to the Commission’s September 26, 2016 authorization, was double the page length allotted under COMAR 20.07.02.13(C). The State challenged the allegations in its October 5, 2016 Opposition to the Motion.

After considering this matter, the Commission denies WGL's Motion to Strike, reserving the right to address any violations of COMAR 20.07.02.13 in its Appeal Order. The Commission grants WGL's request for additional time to respond to UMCP's Memorandum on Appeal, and directs WGL to file its Reply Memoranda and 17 copies, double-sided, and in a 12-point or greater font size, by October 21, 2016.
