Dear Mr. Beugelmans:

The Public Service Commission (“Commission”) has reviewed the Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct a 15.0 MW Solar Photovoltaic Generating Facility in Worcester County, Maryland filed on November 6, 2015 by Longview Solar, LLC (“Longview” or “Applicant”). Longview is proposing to construct a 15.0 MW alternating current solar photovoltaic facility on a 125-acre development envelope across three parcels located on Public Landing Road in Worcester County, Maryland. The Application indicates that because of the nature of solar installations, environmental impacts from this project will be minimal and the long-term benefits significant.

After review of the Application, the Commission hereby docket the matter as Case No. 9405, sets the matter for hearing, and delegates the matter to the Public Utility Law Judge Division to conduct the proceedings.
