PUBLIC UTILITY LAW JUDGE'S NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO INTERVENE

On March 11, 2016, the Maryland Public Service Commission ("Commission") docketed a proceeding to determine whether it is in the public interest to allow a competitive local exchange telephone company ("CLEC") having 20,000 or fewer subscribers to provide regulated service without requiring the CLEC to file a tariff schedule of rates and charges with the Commission, pursuant to Section 4-202(c)(2) of the Public Utilities Article, *Annotated Code of Maryland*. It set the matter for hearing and delegated the proceedings to the Public Utility Law Judge Division.

Petitions to intervene in the matter shall be filed by April 20, 2016. An original and 17 paper copies, and an electronic copy, of the petition shall be submitted to: David J.
