The Public Service Commission (“Commission”) has reviewed the Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct a 18.40 MW Solar Photovoltaic Generating Facility in Washington County, Maryland filed on September 19, 2016 by Mason Dixon Solar Center, LLC (“Mason Dixon Solar” or “Applicant”). Mason Dixon Solar is proposing to construct a 18.4 MW solar generating facility on a private property parcel owned by 2003 Mason Dixon, LLC located south of Pennsylvania Route 163 (Mason Dixon Road) and east of a Norfolk Southern Railway line in Washington County, Maryland. The Application indicates that this project will have minimal environmental impact, provide economic benefits to the State, and a will not have a negative impact on the stability and reliability of the electrical system.

After review of the Application, the Commission hereby docket the matter as Case No. 9426, sets the matter for hearing, and delegates the matter to the Public Utility Law Judge Division to conduct the proceedings.
