The Public Service Commission (“Commission”) has reviewed the Application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to Construct a 9.0 MW Solar Photovoltaic Generating Facility in Cecil County, Maryland filed on May 10, 2017 by Chesapeake Solar LLC (“Chesapeake Solar” or “Applicant”). Chesapeake Solar is proposing to construct a 9.0 MW solar generating facility and accompanying interconnection distribution line on a 55 acre portion of a land parcel totaling approximately 97.5 acres located in an unincorporated area of Cecil County, Maryland. The Application indicates that this project will have minimal environmental impact and will provide significant economic benefits to the State.

After review of the Application, the Commission hereby docket the matter as Case No. 9451, sets the matter for hearing, and delegates the matter to the Public Utility Law Judge Division to conduct the proceedings.
