**NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT – REQUEST FOR REHEARING**

**To: Service lists for Case Nos. 9153, 9154, 9155, 9156, 9157, and 9362; Maryland Department of Housing and Community Development; Department of Human Resources, Office of Home Energy Programs; and Interested Persons**

On August 27, 2018, Potomac Electric Power Company, Delmarva Power & Light Company, and Baltimore Gas and Electric Company (“Petitioners”) filed a Request for Rehearing of the Public Service Commission of Maryland (“Commission”) Order No. 88783 in the above-captioned proceedings (“Request”). The Petitioners seek a rehearing of the Order on two items: (1) the date by which the EmPOWER Maryland utilities must cease using existing printed materials that do not contain the newly approved logo, and (2) the directive that the EmPOWER Maryland utilities must file in their 2018 Q1 and Q2 plans a request for guidance on how to handle a large inventory of existing printed materials. The Petitioners ask the Commission to modify its Order “to state that the utilities may continue to use their existing printed materials through December 31, 2018, and set an October 1, 2018 deadline for electronic materials.”

Any comments on the Request shall be filed by September 13, 2018. An original and 17 paper copies, and one electronic copy, of the comments shall be addressed to Terry J.
