# PUBLIC UTILITY LAW JUDGE'S NOTICE OF EVENING HEARING FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

On December 20, 2016, Egypt Road Solar, LLC ("Applicant") submitted an application for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity ("Application") to construct a 45.9 megawatt solar photovoltaic generating facility on three parcels totaling approximately 320 acres across two properties in the southernmost portion of the City of Cambridge, Dorchester, County, Maryland ("City") (identified as Tax Map 41, Parcel 2 and Parcel 128).1

An evening hearing for the purpose of receiving comments from the public on the Application has been scheduled as follows:

The Applicant is hereby directed to:

- Once in each of the four successive weeks immediately before the evening hearing date:
  - Publish notice of the evening hearing, including the caption, case number, time, date, and location and the purpose of the hearing as a display advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation throughout the City of Cambridge and Dorchester County; and
  - Post on at least two routinely used social media platforms, such as Facebook or Twitter, and use any other means of communications at its disposal to further notify City and County residents of the date, time and location of the evening hearing and the date by which written public comments may be filed.<sup>2</sup>
- At least four weeks prior to the date of the evening hearing until the day after the evening hearing, post on its home website page a notice of the evening hearing in a manner so that an individual need not click the link to determine the date, time, location and purpose of the hearing and the date by which written public comments may be filed.
- File a certificate(s) of publication and postings with the Commission on or before the date of the evening hearing.
- Prominently post on the day of the hearing, no later than noon (ET), an informational sign at or near the public entrance of the Dorchester County Public Library. Each sign shall be at least 17 inches by 22 inches in size and state
