Maryland PSC to Hold Virtual Public Comment Hearing for BGE Transmission Line Project

(BALTIMORE, MD-September 8, 2020) – The Maryland Public Service Commission will hold a virtual public comment hearing on the request by Baltimore Gas and Electric Company to rebuild the Five Forks transmission line between Harford County and the Maryland/Pennsylvania border. The hearing will be held **Tuesday, September 22, 2020 at 7 p.m. via Webex** and will be conducted by Public Utility Law Judge Jennifer Grace.

The project consists of a re-build of a 1.89-mile segment of an existing 115kV dual circuit transmission line segment between BGE's Five Forks substation in northern Harford County, Maryland and the Maryland/Pennsylvania border, and involves removal of two existing parallel single-circuit steel lattice towers, supported electric transmission lines, and replacing them with one double-circuit weathering steel monopole line.
