## Maryland PSC to Hold Second Public Comment Hearing for Jade Meadow Solar Project

(BALTIMORE, MD-February 24, 2021) – The Maryland Public Service Commission will hold a second virtual public comment hearing on the plan by Point Reyes Energy Partners, LLC to build a 19.84 MW solar generating facility in Allegany County, Maryland. The hearing, to be conducted by Public Utility Law Judge Christine Burke, will be held on **Wednesday, March 10, 2021 at 7:00 p.m.** The first hearing in this case was held August 11, 2020.

The project, known as Jade Meadow Solar, is slated to be constructed in Frostburg on 113 acres of property owned by the Allegany Coal and Land Company, and which had previously been used for a surface coal mine. The project also includes an optional 6.4 MW energy storage component.
