PSC to Convene Annual Supplier Diversity Hearing

Utilities spent more than \$800 million with diverse suppliers

(BALTIMORE, MD-July 12, 2018) – The Maryland Public Service Commission will hold its annual hearing for utility companies to report on their contracts with diverse suppliers. The hearing will be held on **Tuesday**, **July 24**, **2018 beginning at 10:00 am** in the Frank O. Heintz Hearing Room, 16th Floor, William Donald Schaefer Tower, 6 St. Paul Street, Baltimore, MD 21202.

The proceeding will review the 2017 diverse supplier procurements, totaling more than \$800 million by participating companies, which include electric, natural gas, transportation and telecommunication providers. The utility companies reported spending nearly \$3.3 billion on all goods and services in 2017. The 24.84% total diverse spend ratio—a key metric of the program--represented a 17% increase over the previous year, and is the highest recorded since the program began in 2009.

The Commission's Public Conference 16 on Supplier Diversity (PC16) is aimed at providing women-, minority- and service-disabled veteran-owned businesses, as well as nonprofit organizations, with greater opportunities to compete for contracts and subcontracts with public utilities. Fifteen companies filed annual reports with the Commission detailing their diverse spend for the 2017 calendar year, with a goal of awarding 25% of their total spend to diverse suppliers.

Of the 15 companies which filed reports, six of them met or exceeded that goal in 2017:

- Association of Maryland Pilots (39.5% -- \$448,000 total diverse spend)
- Potomac Edison (34.4% -- \$13.8 million total diverse spend)
- Baltimore Gas & Electric Company (29.7% -- \$251.8 million total diverse spend)
- AT&T (26.75% -- \$18.3 million total diverse spend)
- Comcast (26.71% -- \$102.2 million total diverse spend)
- Potomac Electric Power Company (25.7% -- \$149.8 million total diverse spend)
