## Maryland PSC to Hold Virtual Public Forum for BGE Transmission Line Project

(BALTIMORE, MD-May 7, 2021) – The Maryland Public Service Commission will hold a virtual informational and public comment hearing on a 20-mile transmission line project proposed by Baltimore Gas and Electric Company. The hearing, to be conducted by Public Utility Law Judge Kristin Case Lawrence, will be held **Thursday**, **May 20, 2021 at 6:30 p.m.** 

According to its application, BGE's Five Forks to Windy Edge Transmission Line Reliability Project consists of replacing an existing double-circuit, 115-kilovolt (kV) overhead transmission line and its associated lattice structures with a new line mounted on weathering steel poles. The line is located in the northeastern section of BGE's electric distribution service territory and runs from BGE's Five Forks Substation, located in northern Harford County (near MD 136 and MD 24), to the vicinity of BGE's Windy Edge Substation, located in northern Baltimore County (near Harford Road and Northwind Road). According to BGE, the project is necessary to address ongoing reliability issues with the existing line segment.

The hearing will begin with a presentation by BGE, followed by brief statements from the Power Plant Research Program of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources; the Maryland Office of People's Counsel; and the Commission's Technical Staff.

The hearing will be held on the Webex platform and participants will receive an email with the link to join the hearing.
