NOTICE OF OPPORTUNITY TO RESPOND

To: All Parties of Record and Interested Persons

On December 20, 2018, Power Plant Research Program ("PPRP"), Department of Natural Resources, filed with the Maryland Public Service Commission ("Commission") a Motion to Dismiss the Application of Transource Maryland, LLC for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity without Prejudice or, in the Alternative, to Suspend the Schedule ("Motion").¹ In its Motion, PPRP alleges that Transource failed "to carry out the predicate analysis required in §7-209 of the Public Utilities Article ("PUA"). Public Utilities Article §7–209, which requires that

(a) The Commission shall examine alternatives to the construction of a new transmission line in a service area, including the use of an existing transmission line of another company, if:

(1) the existing transmission line is convenient to the service area; or

(2) the use of the transmission line will best promote economic and efficient service to the public.

(b) In considering the use of an existing transmission line under subsection (a) of this section, the Commission need not consider whether the company that owns the line has a franchise in a service area."

PPRR states that "Transource did not identify, nor did it provide the required examination under §7-209 of the PUA of specific existing electric transmission lines as an alternative to building the new transmission line proposed by the Applicant. (footnote omitted)."
