NOTICE OF PUBLIC CONFERENCE AND OPPORTUNITY TO COMMENT

In the 2021 session, the General Assembly enacted Public Utilities Article, Section 4-309 which became law on May 30, 2021. That Section provides, *inter alia*, "Subject to the approval of the Commission, a utility company shall adopt a limited-income mechanism to benefit an eligible limited-income customer." To date, only The Potomac Edison Company has filed a proposal for the Commission's consideration, which has been deferred to Phase II. The Commission is aware that inflation in the economy and increases in utility rates have caused a strain on many limited income customers. In light of the mandatory requirement of § 4-309(c)(1), the Commission finds it is time to focus on the development of such limited-income mechanisms.

Accordingly, the Commission initiates Public Conference 59 ("PC59") to consider comments from the utilities and receive suggestions from interested persons for limited-income mechanisms. Utilities that have not done so to date and interested persons shall e-file comments⁴
