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**NOTICE OF MARYLAND SUPPLIER DIVERSITY PROGRAM HEARING:
PUBLIC CONFERENCE 52**

The Commission will continue its annual review of the Maryland Supplier Diversity Program by holding a hearing to begin at 10:00 a.m., on Tuesday, June 20, 2023, at Southern Maryland Electric Cooperative, Engineering and Operations Center, 14950 Cooperative Place, Hughesville, MD 20637.

The purpose of the hearing is:

- (1) to consider the upcoming report from the Commission’s Technical Staff (“Staff”) that summarizes the data from the 2022 Maryland Supplier Diversity Program Annual Reports filed with the Commission by the Reporting Companies,¹ including any issues that may have come to Staff’s attention during its review of the 2022 Annual Reports (“Staff Report”);

- (2) to hear comments from each Reporting Company on the Staff Report and to discuss with representatives of each Company² the status of the Company's efforts towards implementing the MOU, including goals, data collection, resolution of disputes, etc.; and
- (3) to hear comments on the theme of this year's conference: "30th Anniversary of the Supplier Diversity Program".

This year, the Commission celebrates the 30th Anniversary of the Supplier Diversity program. In 1993, the Commission created the first of many memoranda of understanding with regulated utilities after receiving encouragement from then-Maryland state delegates Howard Rawlings and Elijah Cummings to establish a specialized supplier diversity program at the Public Service Commission. In its current form, the PC52 Supplier Diversity Program has a stated goal within each MOU for companies to award 25 percent of their total dollars spent on procurement to diverse suppliers (minority-owned enterprises, women-owned enterprises, service-disabled veteran-owned enterprises, veteran-owned enterprises, LGBT-owned enterprises, and not-for-profit workshops). As of 2023, the Commission has received, in total, 20 signed MOUs since the inception of the program. The Commission looks forward to hearing the utilities' perspectives on the history of the Supplier Diversity Program and their outlook for the future.

At the hearing, the Commission will receive limited live testimony from certain parties, including utility companies, minority⁰ and women-owned business enterprises, and Staff.³
