Maryland PSC to Hold Two Public Hearings for Columbia Gas System Improvement Plan

(BALTIMORE, MD-June 14, 2018) – The Maryland Public Service Commission will hold two public hearings this month on the application by Columbia Gas of Maryland to adopt a new gas system infrastructure and improvement plan and the surcharge to fund it. Columbia's program, known as STRIDE (for <u>strategic infrastructure development and enhancement)</u> would result in a monthly surcharge at the \$2.00 rate cap for each residential customer and \$6.95 for small commercial customers, effective January 1, 2019. Columbia serves approximately 33,000 customers in Allegany, Garrett and Washington counties through 658 miles of pipeline.

Columbia's current STRIDE program was implemented as a result of legislation passed by the Maryland General Assembly in 2013; the company's program is scheduled to end in late 2018. For 2019-2023, Columbia plans to replace 42.5 miles of bare steel and cast iron mains and associated services, at a cost of \$16-\$19 million per year.

Members of the public who wish to comment on the matter may attend one or both of the hearings before Public Utility Law Judge Kristin Case Lawrence. The hearings are scheduled as follows:
