Virtual Public Hearing Set for 45.8 MW Solar Facility Proposed for Wicomico County

(BALTIMORE, MD) – Local residents and other interested members of the public are invited to comment on a proposal by Porter Mill, LLC to build a 45.8 MW solar facility in Wicomico County. The virtual hearing will take place on **Wednesday**, **November 1**, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. Public Utility Law Judge Jennifer J. Grace will preside.

Porter Mill, LLC has applied to the Maryland Public Service Commission for what is known as a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN), which grants an applicant the authority to construct an energy generating station or high-voltage transmission line in Maryland. According to the application, the project will be constructed on 268 acres at the intersection of Ocean Gateway (Route 50) and Porter Mill Road in the town of Hebron.

The hearing will include a presentation by the applicant, the Power Plant Research Program of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, the Maryland Office of People's Counsel, and the Commission's Technical Staff, followed by an opportunity for members of the public to comment on the proposed project.
