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**NOTICE OF ADDITIONAL VIRTUAL RULEMAKING SESSION (RM56)
AND COMMENT DEADLINES**

The Commission hereby gives notice that it will conduct another rulemaking session on Tuesday, August 24, 2021 and if needed, Thursday, August 26, 2021 at 10:00 AM, via virtual meeting.¹ The purpose of the rulemaking session is to continue considering two sets of proposed revisions to the Code of Maryland Regulations (“COMAR”) 20.62: (1) the regulations proposed on November 18, 2020 by the Coalition for Community Solar Access, Maryland-DC-Delaware-Virginia Solar Energy Industries Association, and Low and Moderate Income Advocates;² and (2) the proposed regulations filed on February 1, 2021 by the Commission’s Technical Staff.³ Copies of the proposed revised regulations and various comments may be accessed from the Commission’s web page www.psc.state.md.us, in the electronic case jacket for this docket (RM56).
