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NOTICE OF RULE MAKING SESSION

The Public Service Commission (“Commission”) hereby provides notice of a rule making session on October 19, 2017 to consider revisions to the Code of Maryland Regulations (“COMAR”) 20.90.01, .02, and .03 regarding taxicab services in Baltimore City, Baltimore County, City of Cumberland, and City of Hagerstown. On July 14, 2017, the Commission Staff (“Staff”) submitted proposed revisions to the Commission’s Taxicab regulations as a result of the Commission’s directive in a previous rule making session held on November 7, 2016, in this Administrative Docket. Specifically, Staff’s proposed revisions address issues raised by the Maryland Chapter of the National Federation of the Blind, make conforming revisions to the taxicab regulations governing taxicab operations in Hagerstown and Cumberland, and address the possible regulation of taxicabs in other jurisdictions, including St. Mary’s County.¹

Each filing should consist of an original and seventeen (17) two-sided paper copies, and include an electronic version of the filing. The applicable Administrative Docket number (RM58) must appear in the subject line of the cover letter. Five paper copies of the filing shall be three-hole punched. The Commission encourages the parties to use its “eFile” system to submit the electronic version of the filing.
