NOTICE INITIATING RULEMAKING (RM69) AND

NOTICE OF VIRTUAL RULEMAKING SESSION

The Maryland Public Service Commission hereby initiates an Administrative Docket, RM69, to consider revisions to the Code of Maryland Regulations ("COMAR") 20.79.01, 20.79.02, and 20.79.03. On April 7, 2020, the Commission's Technical Staff ("Staff") submitted a Petition to Establish a Rulemaking for the Adoption of Regulations Governing Additional Notice, Pre-Application, and Application Requirements for Construction of Certain Fossil Fuel Generating Stations. The purpose of the proposed regulations is to align the Commission's Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN) regulations with federal requirements under Title VI to ensure that affected communities are given a meaningful opportunity to participate in the permitting process that would authorize the construction of a large fossil fuel generating station. The petition includes a description of the history and background underlying the proposed regulations, including the Informal Resolution Agreement the Commission entered into with the U.S. Department of Transportation to resolve the Title VI Complaint concerning the CPCN issued to Mattawoman Energy, LLC (Case No. 9330) in 2015, and includes two attachments.

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Comments on the proposed revisions to 20.79.01, 20.79.02, and 20.79.03 shall be e-filed

whether to publish the proposed revisions to COMAR 20.79.01, 20.79.02, and 20.79.03 as

initially submitted, or as revised based on comments received. If the Commission approves the

proposed regulations for publication, the proposed regulations will be published in the Maryland

Register for notice and comment as provided for by the Maryland Administrative Procedures

Act.
