Revisions to COMAR 20.79 Administrative Docket RM72

Notice of Virtual Rulemaking Session (RM72) Regarding Application Requirements

For A Certificate Of Public Convenience And Necessity

On December 23, 2020 the Commission initiated an Administrative Docket, RM72, to consider revisions to Code of Maryland Regulations ("COMAR") 20.79. The Commission requested comments on the proposed revisions to COMAR 20.79 by Friday, February 5, 2021, and received a number of comments from various parties.

Accordingly, the Commission hereby gives notice that it will conduct a rulemaking session on Monday, March 29, 2021 at 10:00 AM, and, if needed, Tuesday, March 30, 2021 at 10:00 AM, via virtual meeting.² The purpose of the rule making session is to consider the proposed regulations filed on December 18, 2020 by the Commission's Technical Staff, as well as comments received from the parties. 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On December 18, 2020, following a September 23, 2020 Notice of Intent to Initiate a Rulemaking from the Commission and various comments from interested parties, the Commission's Technical Staff submitted a Petition for a Rulemaking for the purpose of revising the COMAR provisions governing applications for a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity to include certain application requirements, including the establishment of a new pre-application process, for the construction of large-scale generating stations.
