SOUTHERN MARYLAND ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE ANNUAL REPORT ON SUPPLIER DIVERSITY

March 31, 2010

For the period July 15, 2009 through December 31, 2009

PROGRAM ACTIVITIES

INTERNAL COOPERATIVE PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

The Cooperative executed the Supplier Diversity Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on July 15, 2009. At that time, the Cooperative had no existing program, database, or data collection process to make any type of determination as to which of the two to three thousand active vendors were minority-, women-, or service disabled veteran-owned businesses or other non-profit eligible organizations. A new program was required and five initial tasks were identified to develop the program. The initial program tasks were to:

- Compare Federal small business subcontracting requirements with the Supplier
 Diversity MOU requirements and develop a process to collect applicable information on suppliers;
- 2. Educate internal procurement personnel on the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS) codes;
- 3. Determine applicable corporate "spend" in order to determine magnitude of program and identify major areas of opportunity to reach aspirational goals;
- 4. Investigate additional outreach opportunities that target diverse suppliers; and
- 5. Leverage existing state, regional, or local business programs involving small and diverse businesses.

To facilitate the Supplier Diversity Program, the Cooperative developed a consolidated Supplier Information form to begin collecting applicable supplier information. Through outreach activities, the Supplier Information form was provided to various vendors. After a review of each of these returned forms, refinements were identified and implemented. The information is being transferred to a database.

Several meetings with internal stakeholders provided an opportunity to educate personnel on the NAICS codes and to discuss the strategy to maximize opportunities for diverse suppliers. As the Cooperative moves forward, it plans to develop a program that will enable procurement personnel to query the database for a Qualified Bidders' List (QBLs) by NAICS codes. Solicitation and other procurement documents will require the Supplier Information form to be completed; thus enabling the Cooperative to update and add new eligible supplier information and certifications to the database.

The Cooperative reviewed its purchasing to determine the applicable corporate "spend" to determine the magnitude of the program and to develop a benchmark year and successive measurements. A review was performed and yielded a dollar value of \$30,660,001. This assists in identifying areas of opportunity for additional inclusion of diverse suppliers on QBLs and for focus on the outreach efforts.

There is a Minority Business Task Force lead by the Tri-County Council for Southern Maryland. Various stakeholders, including minority- and women-owned businesses; Maryland Procurement and Technical Assistance Program; Charles, Calvert, and St. Mary's County Economic Development agencies participated in this effort. The Task Force is developing a regional (Southern Maryland) website where purchasers can post their procurement opportunities by NAICS code and suppliers can view all scopes of

work, determine which opportunities are of interest, and download bid packages as desired.

SUMMARY

The Cooperative initially had no electronic capability to measure its use of diverse suppliers or to collect, analyze, track, or report use of eligible spend, procurements by diverse suppliers or NAICS codes. The framework being developed will provide a benchmark year for reference purposes. Supplier information has initially begun to be collected and through a manual process, QBLs may be based upon NAICS code in the supplier database. The outreach effort includes new relationships with organizations and expansion of existing business relationships with other organizations.

The program has been initiated with final testing of the Cooperative's website for online supplier registration or download of Supplier Information form and a program information brochure is scheduled for completion in early 2010.

PRIME CONTRACTOR USE OF SUBCONTRACTORS

SUBCONTRACTING PROGRAM

The Cooperative updated its procedures, including a Board policy to reflect procurement changes. One example of the revised procedures is that contractors are required to submit a subcontracting plan when the value of a contract exceeds \$550,000. Initially, the Cooperative will request contractors voluntarily provide subcontracting "spend" reports.

COMPLAINT REVIEW PROCESS

DIVERSE SUPPLIER COMPLAINT PROCESS

The Cooperative's program procedures are for the Contract Administrator to investigate all complaints. The use of an independent party or software tool is under consideration in the future. One product, Ethics Point, provided a demonstration on August 11, 2009. SMECO will investigate this option further.

LIST OF DIVERSE SUPPLIERS

A Supplier information form was not finalized until mid-December and responses are expected.

RECRUITING ACTIVITIES

EXTERNAL OUTREACH

The Cooperative's representatives attended a variety of events sponsored by local chambers of commerce, minority business groups, business expos, professional organizations, industry organizations, and state, regional and county agency economic development events. Some events included the Cooperative's sponsorship of a workshop or providing a speaker on the MOU. The Cooperative's participation in the PC 16 Workgroup and Utility Forum on Supplier Diversity has provided additional insight to other methods and techniques used by other utilities. In addition, the Cooperative responded to 129 inquiries via e-mail, telephone, and correspondence during the

reporting period. Additional communications with potential suppliers occurred during outreach events.
