## Third Public Hearing Scheduled for Solar Facility Proposed to be Sited in Carroll County

(BALTIMORE, MD) – Local residents and other interested members of the public are again invited to comment on a proposal by Chaberton Solar Sunshine, LLC to construct a 3.0 MW solar project in Carroll County. The virtual hearing will take place on **Thursday, June 5, 2025 at 7 p.m.** before Public Utility Law Judge Jennifer J. Grace. Previous public hearings in this case were held in November 2024 and in April of this year. (This third hearing was originally scheduled for May 21, 2025 but has been moved to the June date.)

In April 2024, Chaberton Solar Sunshine applied to the Maryland Public Service Commission for what is known as a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN), which grants an applicant the authority to construct an energy generating station in Maryland. According to the application, the developer proposes to build the project, intended as part of Maryland's community solar program, on approximately 16.5 acres of a 125-acre site at 940 Fannie Dorsey Road (near the intersection with Sacramento Drive), in Sykesville.

In addition to taking comments from the public, the hearing will include a presentation by the applicant, brief statements by the parties, including the Power Plant Research Program of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, the Maryland Office of People's Counsel (the state's ratepayer advocate), and the Commission's Technical Staff, as to their respective roles in the case.
