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Public Hearing Scheduled for Solar Facility Proposed to be Sited in Cecil County

(BALTIMORE, MD) – Local residents and other interested members of the public are invited to comment on a proposal by Halo Colora LLC to construct a 5.0 MW solar project in Cecil County. The virtual hearing will take place on **Wednesday, April 16, 2025 at 6:30 p.m.** before Public Utility Law Judge Kristin Case Lawrence.

In December 2024, Halo Colora applied to the Maryland Public Service Commission for what is known as a Certificate of Public Convenience and Necessity (CPCN), which grants an applicant the authority to construct an energy generating station in Maryland. According to the application, the developer proposes to build the project, intended as part of Maryland's community solar program, on 21.5 acres of a 115.5acre site at 308 Theodore Road in Port Deposit.

In addition to taking comments from the public, the hearing will include a presentation by the applicant, brief statements by the parties, including the Power Plant Research Program of the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, the Maryland Office of People's Counsel (the state's ratepayer advocate), and the Commission's Technical Staff, as to their respective roles in the case.
