(BALTIMORE, MD) – The Maryland Public Service Commission has scheduled a virtual public comment hearing on the rate increase request filed in May by Washington Gas Light Company. The utility's customers and other interested parties are welcome to take part in the hearing on **Thursday, September 21, 2023 at 7 p.m.**

According to WGL's application, the company proposes a rate increase of \$49.4 million, which it says will increase the average residential heating and cooling customer's bill by 5.3 percent per year. The company provides natural gas distribution service to more than 513,000 customers in six Maryland counties: Calvert, Charles, Frederick, Montgomery, Prince George's and St. Mary's.
